Unicorn Poop Bark

Yummy, delicious White Chocolate Unicorn Poop Bark - Only 3 ingredients and the best part about it is how super, crazy easy it is to make!!!

Ingredients

- White chocolate wafers
- Food coloring
- Colored & star sprinkles

Instructions

1. Melt the chocolate according to the directions on the package
2. Evenly distribute the chocolate into three separate dishes
3. Add 1-2 drops of food coloring and stir. Add additional drops until you get your desired color
4. Pour each color chocolate on to waxed paper - you will want to pour them separately on the sheet in a triangle (2 of the colors next to each other and one above the other two) and then using a spatula, swirl the colors together - don't over swirl them or it will just turn into a dark mush of a color)
5. Sprinkle the sprinkles on top and let cool completely (you can stick in the refrigerator for a few minutes to help it set faster, but don't leave in there too long or it could affect the color)
6. Break up the bark into pieces and serve

Glow in the Dark Bowling

Glow sticks are the secret behind this nighttime game that the kids will love! It's perfect for summertime fun and great for a family camping trip. However, you don't have to reserve this fun glowing game for summer, it's great for indoor fun as well. Are you hosting a slumber party or having a few friends over to spend the night? Turn off all the lights and enjoy a fun game of indoor bowling!

Aside from some plastic water bottles and glow sticks, you'll need a good sturdy ball, like a soccer ball, to bowl down your glow-in-the-dark pins. You can find glow sticks in the party aisle at discount department stores, or check your local dollar store.



Parents, you will need:

10 water bottles
10 glow sticks in a variety of colors
Soccer ball

Remove any labels from your water bottles. If water bottles are new and still contain water, pour out a little off the top to allow for the glow stick you'll be adding.

Crack the glow sticks to activate them (according to package directions) and drop one glow stick in each bottle. Replace the lid on the bottle securely.

Line bottles up like bowling pins. The back row should have 4 pins, the next row will have 3, next 2, and

finally 1 at the front.

To keep the game fair, especially if you have a range of ages playing, set a distance for each age group. Smaller children are allowed to stand closer to the pins while older kids that need more of a challenge should stand farther back

GO IN THE BASEMENT TO PLAY

DIY SOAP POPS

You need:

- Melt and pour clear soap
- Flower petals
- Ice lolly mould
- Pop sticks
- Essential Oils
- Pink food colouring
- Retractable knife



Step one:

Cut the soap into small chunks. Estimate how much you need by placing the small pieces into the moulds. You can always add more later though. Place in a microwave safe bowl and melt on a high heat for around 30-45 seconds at a time. Stir the soap in between heatings.



Step two:

Once the soap is completely melted drop in 10-15 drops of the essential oil and about a teaspoon of pink food colouring. Mix both of these in well.



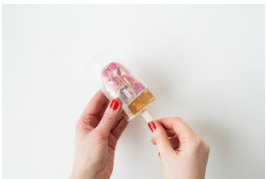
Step three:

Place your lolly mould onto a plate just in case it falls over. Sprinkle in the flower petals. Don't push them down to fill the mould – let the petals sit loosely on top of each other.



Step four:

By this point the soap should be starting to harden around the edge. This means it has cooled enough to keep most of the pigment in the flower petals. Pour the soap into the mould. If you need to you can stop, add more petals and continue to pour. After a few minutes the soap will start to set. Push the lollipop stick into the middle.



Step five:

Leave the soap to set for around 6 hours minimum. If you're unsure if they have set leave overnight to be certain. Carefully push the knife in between the soap and the mould. You should see the air begin to separate them. Squeeze the sides of the mould together to encourage the air to the bottom of the mould. Repeat this step on the other side and pull on the lollipop stick to remove the soap from the mould. Don't worry of the knife has created a dent in the soap. You can rub it out with some water.



Step six:

Cut the edge of the soap neatly around the stick and your soap pop is ready. Wrap up in cellophane and ribbon and label to make sure the recipient know's it's not edible. There's nothing romantic about eating soap!
