

INDEPENDENT LIVING

This past quarter we have seen an increase in many areas. Residents are responding to what they are supposed to do with incentives and individualized lessons. Overall, 5 of the 6 areas scored above 70% completion, with 2 scoring above 80%, and 1 area scoring above 90%.

The results from this most recent quarter are as follows: We had 12 residents participating in our girls' life-skills program at different times across the quarter and 6 residents in our boys' home. The active achievement rate of youth 16 years and older was as follows:

- ➤ 6 Total residents 16 or older (5 girls, 1 boys)
- ➤ Job seeking and Job performance of the 6 residents, 3 held jobs: 3 maintained employment (1 w/ the assistance of OOD) & 1 additional resident got a job at age 15 for the summer. Total of 4 residents (over 16) working
- Meal planning 73%. Increased 16%
- ➤ Shopping List 47% increased 6%
- Meal Prep 71% increased 14% (hands on area 1 girl achieved 100% in all areas, 3 of 6 girls achieved over 90% in all areas)

All residents 14 older

- ➤ Chore completion 72%
- ➤ Laundry completion 86% increase from previous quarter
- Weekly Life-skills Lessons 94%
- > 9 of 18 residents received 70% or more in all areas
- > 5 of 18 residents received 80% or more in all areas.
- ➤ 4 of 18 residents received 90% or more in all areas.

STAFF AND RESIDENTS BEGINNING WITH US

Residents:

We had five new residents join us last quarter, one boy and four girls.

Staff:

We had two new male staff added to our group.

SAYING GOODBYE

Residents:

Four residents were discharged, three girls and one boy.

Of the four residents only one will be going into our aftercare program. He reunified with mom and is doing well. The three girls were discharged to more restrictive placements due to a decline in mental health. The others were due to atrisk behavioral concerns.

Staff:

There were no changes in staff. They are all still with us and we are thankful for them.

Training for the quarter consisted of watching the movie The Ride, a video on Proactive Parenting and the yearly renewal of ACT- Acceptance and Commitment Therapy Training.

We also joined with a new county Crawford County.

Earning Fun

Any resident that did not receive a behavioral critical in the month can earn a day of fun at the end of the month.

June – Kennywood Amusement Park - 3 girls and 6 boys

Positive Performers


We love to catch our young ones doing well. Between both homes we wrote 134 rewards between all residents. We also gave out several weekly rewards for great behavior for those that did not have a critical or minor report in the week.

Number of Restraints:

Boys House: 2 restraints – 2 incident reports 0 in April and

Girls House: 2 restraints − 2 incidents. 0 restraints in April 😂





The girls' incidents decreased to 2 restraints this quarter, two separate incidents. Both same girl, two different staff, pattern just in the fact that it is the same girl who is increasing in aggression which is being monitored.

Fresh Starts

Three boys were eligible to participate in our Aftercare Program in the last quarter.

- -1 boy is doing well in Bridges living at MOAB House, a transitional home for emancipated youth. He is working and saving money.
- 1 boy reunified with his mom and is doing well.
- -1 boy reunified with grandmother, he was removed once and then grandmother declined our help and will not take our calls.

Our residents receive their education in the least restrictive environment to best fit their needs. Resident placements as follows:

We are serviced by the Village Network for our counseling, medication management, and group needs.

Out of 25 residents, being served are as follows:
Individual Counseling-24
Outside counseling- 1
Family Counseling- 5
Outside family Counseling - 1
Medication Management-19
Outside med manage- 2
Residents not on psychotropics- 4
Group Sessions- 25



Critical Incidents

Boys

48 CIR's 66 Incidents... an increase from 38 criticals the previous quarter. The highest areas were other unusual incidents with 17 other various incidents, 11 AWOLs and 11 returns, no pattern involving residents or staff to discern that a child was being singled out etc. May was the highest month for incidents.

Girls

75 CIR's,105

incidents...maintained almost the same as previous quarter. The largest areas of incidents were other unusual incidents 34 other-various, 11 non-routine medical treatment. AWOLs at 11 and return from AWOLs at 10. April was the highest month with 51 incidents. No pattern involving residents or staff to discern that a child was being singled out etc. Our women tend to over report to keep counties well informed.

Note: Multiple incident behaviors may be involved in one critical.

Progress towards Goals:

Residents making progress in or having achieved 100% of objectives-3 boys! What an accomplishment! WOW!

Residents making progress in or already having achieved 90%-99% of objectives was 4 girls and 3 boys.

Residents making progress in or already having achieved 80 -89 % of objectives: 2 girls and 4 boys.

Residents making progress in or already having achieved 70-79% of objectives: 4 Boys, and 1 Girl.

Result 17 of 21 making progress in or already achieved 70% or higher of objectives 7 of 11 girls. 10 of 10 boys were above 80%.

Residents making progress in, or already having achieved less than 70 % of goals: 2 Boys, 2 Girls

Of the 4 that scored below 70%:

 All girls, 1 girl is new and established in the beginning of June. The other 3 unfortunately were discharged to more restrictive environments due to decline in mental health, and behaviors.

Five of our residents, two girls and 3 boys earned a trip to Tennessee. Where they got to enjoy fun, entertainment, with the cabin life, explore the Forbidden Cavern, ride on ATV's at Jayell Ranch, shopping at Flea Traders Paradise, and had a blast at Dollywood's Amusement Park.
